Sounds like the definition of prejudice. And, I just looked up '*prejudice*' in a simple Collins Dictionary that I use, and this is part of what it says:

- 1. an unreasonable or unfair dislike or preference;
- 2. intolerance of or dislike for people because they belong to a specific race, religion, or group.

The negative power of paranoia should not be underestimated. People have formed all sorts of ill notions about Witches, Witchcraft, Magic and Pagans, and act on such preconceptions accordingly. They think fear, so they're afraid. They think they're under attack, so they get defensive or launch a counter-attack (and actually call it a 'righteous' indignation). They think Witches are out to get them, so they get superstitious and blame every undesirable thing that happens around them on Witches.

A while back I had a colleague who wouldn't miss a chance to complain about people, and the only word she seemed to have for describing them was 'witch.' To her, everybody was a Witch and out to get her. She had no idea I am a Witch, even though the clues were always staring her in the face. So, one day I asked her: "Have you ever seen a Witch, I mean, a real Witch?"

"Ooh, those things," she said, "they're everywhere, they're evil, stay away from them."

I kind of looked at her with a half-smile and gently said: "You didn't answer the question."

"Oh, are you kidding me? Everyday. Everywhere. You see that one there," pointing at another member of staff, "she's a Witch. You see that other one there, he's a Witch too, all of them, stay away from them."

I was actually hoping she'd say for me to stay away from she herself too, because she's the 'witch' that should be avoided. Well, I smiled again and continued with my work. Obviously, everyone else is a Witch except her. Some of the men and ladies she called Witches were actually Christians — as a matter of fact, one of them was an assistant Pastor, and one other still in the Seminary. So, it don't matter your religion; if you're not in her good book, you're a Witch. And if the only definition of a Witch was her version of it, I would say she is the queen of Witches. A few days later I saw her in silent tears. "What's going on? Are you ok?" I asked.

"My computer froze; they've put a Spell on it so I'll lose my job." There was no need asking her who put the Spell on it, since the answer was rather so obviously the Witches.

"Have you tried a reboot? It fixes a lot of PC problems, you know." "It will?"

"Try it and let me know."

I didn't hear from her again for about an hour, so I went over to her desk and asked how it went.

"It worked like a charm," she said, "you're my guardian angel. Thank you!"

Of course I was her guardian angel, who would quickly become the Witch out to get her if I dropped my guard for a second. Only two kinds of people exist for her — evil Witches, and guardian angels — nothing in-between.

But honestly, if you're reading this, and you're not a Witch, either my version of it or my colleague's version, I'm still asking: "Have you ever seen a Witch, not a person you think might be a bad person or Witch, but someone who truly is a Witch?" After throwing this simple question around a few times, I concluded that it is the multi-billion-dollar question of all time. Witches are everywhere, yet hardly anyone who's not a Witch can truly say he or she has ever seen a real Witch except as a way of showing contempt or antagonism toward people that fall out of their favor.

home of all that is most modern and enlightened, that we find superstitions commanding most implicit faith." — Oliver M. Hueffer — At a gathering sometime ago I asked a guy what Witches look like. I'd over-heard him bragging that he's an expert on occult matters and all the guises of the anti-Christ. So, with the passion and zealousness of a salesman he said:

"You don't need me to tell you that. Just one look at them and you'd know. In fact I could spend a whole day telling you about them and still not exhaust one-percent of what I know about these people. But one thing I can tell you up-front is that they're evil, pure evil. You don't wanna get in bed with them, or have anything to do with them."

"I have a few minutes to spare, if you don't mind," I said.

"But why? You're not one of them, are you?"

"One of what?"

"Witches."

"Ah, if I was you'd know, since you're the expert; right?"

We chuckled and sat down in the lobby and he said:

"These are people, especially women, who have sold their souls to the Devil and made a deal with him."

"What kind of deal?"

"Oh, you don't wanna know. Their job is to do all the evil you see going on in the world today."

"Is there a way for me to recognize them so I don't get into bed with them?"

"Easy, just say 'Jesus' in your conversation and they'll run. They hate that name."

(I didn't run; and I don't hate the name either.)

"But I mean in appearances or clues; is there a way I can just look at a Witch and know right away and keep my distance?"

"Oh yes. They're usually very pretty and irresistible; and very seductive too."

I've heard such lame statements many times, implying that if a man

is gifted and handsome he's of God; but if a woman is gifted and beautiful she's of the Devil. Very typical of the Inquisition, witchhunters, male chauvinists and misogynists. But generally, woman is associated with beauty; so every woman must be of the Devil then, including Christian women and those of every major religion that has anything against Witches, thus making every woman a *'femme fatale.'* And how so? Well, I asked him:

"And why would she want to seduce me, a fellow woman, especially on a business meeting?"

"They don't care if you're a man or woman. Their job is just to do whatever it takes to lead you into sin, and that's it, because once you sin the Devil has a stake on you, just like that," he said, snapping his fingers concurrently.

Talk about being saved by the bell — just then our host announced that the event was about to start.

"Don't worry, we'll make time to talk about this some more later," he said.

"Sure," I said, hoping never to cross paths with him again.

So, again, you see the rigmarole — people, including socalled experts, dancing around a question as simple and obvious as sunlight, yet claiming to know everything about Witches and Pagans, when all they have is the backwater, storybook, movie, dark-alley, ghetto, flea-market, hair-dressing salon, barber-shop, old wives' tale, superstitious, urban-legend, and disproportionately inflated innuendos and distortions of the true definition of a Witch.

And one thing they all have in common is that they never ever answer that simple question: "Have you ever seen a Witch?" And how hard could it be? It's just a simple question, and a simple 'yes' or 'no' would suffice. Sometimes too I'd ask if anyone has ever seen a ghost, or zombie, vampire, werewolf, UFO, mutant, Santa Claus (not the one that gives out candies to children in the streets and major stores). (And what about angels, demons, etc.?) Their answers and reactions and the look on their faces are always the same — they dodge the question and conceal their ignorance in fancy words comprised mainly of 'evil' and the 'devil,' and sometimes they throw in 'wicked.'

But then, again, Witches, true and real Witches, are everywhere, in plain sight, yet invisible to the un-initiated. As a matter of fact, I'm inclined to say there are more Pagans and Witches today than there's ever been in world-history since the spread of founded religions, and with Paganism considered one of the fastest growing religions of today, the number will surely be forever on the increase. Hooray! People are finally seeing the light!

Tell a potential client or employer or friend or colleague that you're a Witch or Pagan and see what happens. (Please don't do it, unless you really want to.) When you say '*I am a Witch*,' people don't actually hear 'I am a person who respects Nature and tries to be in tune with the Universe' — they hear 'I am a very bad, wicked, evil person who has made a deal with the Devil to jinx everybody else.' And When you say '*I am a Pagan*,' people hardly hear those words come out of your mouth — what they hear is 'I am a heretic, a sinner, a lunatic, an infidel, and a devil-worshiper.' And heaven forbid that you ever open your mouth to say '*I practice Witchcraft*.' Sparks will not just fly off, but take you along with them into the hellish inferno they're convinced is where you belong and should stay and burn relentlessly for all eternity. And hardly any of these folks has taken the time to honestly research Pagans and Witches. For some, if you don't attend the religion of their choice, you're a Pagan, and a sinner, of course, thus the Devil's advocate. According to Wikipedia, "Strmiska highlighted instances in both the US and UK in which school teachers were fired when their employers discovered that they were Pagan." Not funny, seriously! But, we are Pagans and Witches; we're winners (not sinners) — we win — that's what we do best, and should do best — win! (not sin).

Touché!

So, look who's talking. Talk of making a deal with the Devil. And look who's in total denial! They think we don't have enough brains to see through their falsehood, hypocrisy and insecurities. Who actually has made a deal with the Devil? How can Witches make a deal with the Devil when most of us, if not all of us, don't believe in him (his existence)? Who invented the 'Devil' concept? And look who doesn't even know the content of the same Bible that tells them Witches are evil, for in their Bible the Prophet/King Saul desperately consulted with the Witch of Endor for answers and guidance after his God and other Prophets and his dreams had failed him (1 Samuel, 28:3-20). Ironically, this incident took place shortly after the King himself, out of pomposity, pride and ignorance, "had put away those that had familiar spirits, and the wizards, out of the land." This is not the case of the pot calling the kettle black, for there's no kettle here, only the pot thinking that everyone else is as burnt on the stove as itself.

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They say Witches are evil; but has history ever reported of anybody anywhere that was proven to be hurt by a Witch? In the Salem tragedy for example, does history show that anybody was truly hurt by a Witch? But who were the true victims here? Who truly got hurt? As usual, Witches of course! Or those suspected of being Witches. Who else? (As Pagans, not as a nation with a political agenda), does history show that Pagans have ever gone to war against anybody or group of people or other religions or any nation? No! Witches have been, and are still, the victims unjustly and cruelly under attack; and might unfortunately remain so for way too long a time.

Despite the usual contradictions in the Bible, Exodus 20:13 clearly states: "Thou shalt not kill." It didn't say "unless they're thought to be Pagans or Witches." So, who made them kill Pagans? God or the Devil? Since God clearly took a stand in saying 'Thou shalt not kill,' then it must be the Devil. And if the Devil worked with them to kill millions of women and children, who then is really serving and worshiping the Devil? They could have fooled the rest of us. When Jesus was arrested some of his followers wanted to fight back, but he gently restrained them, and went ahead to heal the centurion whose ear Simon Peter had chopped off on impulse. Most Christians are ignorant blind-followers. It is not surprising then that, according to the renowned Mark Twain, "If Jesus was here today he wouldn't be a Christian."

Contrary to popular opinion amongst non-Pagans, we don't do anything dark or evil. Misinformation has always been a strategy for control and manipulation. Thus, misinforming the public about Witches and Pagans has since been a strong, silent and invisible fist that some religions and individuals have used successfully to control, push out and pull in who they want, when and where and how they want it. You want a person thrown out and kept miserable forever? Just say the word 'Witch' while looking at him/her or pointing a finger or talking about him/her. You wanna draw sympathy for your followers and insiders and make them bond together and follow you unquestionably and unflinchingly? Simple! Just say 'Witch' when referring to the outsiders. And to sweeten it up a little bit, promise to protect them from Witches and they'll be yours to keep and sway as you please forever. As Harvey Fierstein would say, "Nothing binds a people to their leader like a common enemy." So they keep people's eyes on us while they do mischief in the background, sort of like the Illusionist's mis-direction.

I've always imagined what it would be like to knock on someone's door and announce "Hi, I'm a Witch, and would like to share a few things from my Book of Shadows with you to help you become a Witch," in the same way some other religions do, and see what happens — scary! — don't do it, please!

I was visiting a friend one morning when a young man knocked on their door, (Saturday 2017/01/21; 11:15AM), and when her husband opened the door the stranger handed him a flyer saying:

"I'm a Christian, and would like to share a few things from the Bible with you."

"What denomination is that?" my host said.

"We're non-denominational Christians."

"Oh, I'm sorry I'm not interested in anything Christian or Islam." "Why is that so, if I may ask?"

"I don't have time for religions that believe they have to kill others to appease their God."

"We Christians don't kill."

"History disagrees with you. Maybe you don't do it anymore today in an obvious way; but what were the Crusades for, the Inquisition, the Salem witch-trials, and all the terrorism going on today?"

"The Crusades were by Catholics, not all Christians."

"Well then, the Protestants ran from England to America to escape religious hostility and persecution, and to have the freedom to practice the religion of their choice, in their own way, but became Puritan enough to instigate the Salem witch-trials. Always the same story with Christians and Muslims: My way or the hell-way!"

"These atrocities and killings you're talking about, do you know where they came from, (where death came from)?"

"I thought your Bible said it was after the fall of Adam and Eve that your God harshly unleashed his wrath and pronounced a perpetual damnation and judgement of hardship, misery, sickness and death on Mankind."

"Death comes from sin, from Satan. And that's why Jesus died for us so we'd be free."

"Well, I don't see anybody free from anything or even the basic troubles of life, like pain, sickness and poverty. Moreover, him dying for anybody also implies a blood-sacrifice to appease your God. I want none of such. The Buddhists believe that anything which has a beginning would have an end; that life is created at conception or birth, thus it has a beginning, therefore it would have to end sometime, someday. Physics holds that everything dies at some point in time; that while some things in existence live briefly, others might live for billions of years, the stars and planets and

"If you were standing in front of God today, what would he say?" "I believe that God, or whatever you call the creator, is everywhere, and that we're standing in his presence right now, all the time. And God doesn't have to be a 'he' — God could also be a 'she' or 'it."" "But God wants to save your soul."

"My soul is mine to keep or dispense with as I please, so your God needs not worry."

As I sat there listening to that conversation and taking notes, I kept wondering what would have happened if my friend's husband told the proselytizer that he's a Pagan or Witch. When it was over I told him he should have told the young man he's a Pagan, and he said "Oh no. At the place we used to live, as we were coming out of the car one day we ran into some people who wanted to share their gospel with us, and we turned them down by saying we weren't interested because we're Pagans, and the next morning we saw that one of our car tires was slashed. After one more incident like that we moved from that apartment complex to this one."

The toughest thing I've had to deal with is the inability to express myself freely amidst some friends, relatives, school-mates, work-colleagues, neighbors and even strangers. And once in a while people ask me questions whose answers would have been so simple, yet I soon realized that one person's 'simple' is another's 'tough,' and my attempts to break the answers down to manageable chunks end up teaching me too. I love to learn, to grow. "Standing still," they say, "means falling behind." Complacency has a high price-tag on it which I can't afford. My ears are always up for anything Pagan, and so I enjoy hearing or reading good Pagan information, or answering sincere Pagan related questions whenever I can, as long as the atmosphere is conducive for it. This book is very much in response to such questions. People ask me:

> "Who is a Pagan? Who is a Witch?" "What is Paganism? What really is Witchcraft?" "What does it mean to be a Pagan?" "How do you become a Pagan or Witch — by baptism, ritual, or what?" "Are there really Witches or just fiction like Vampires, Werewolves and Zombies?" "Is Paganism a feel-good religion?" "What's the place of women in Paganism?" "Which religion is better?"

"Is it true that Pagans and Witches worship Satan?"

"Is it true the Devil makes you do stuff, like hurt people?"

"Is it true you sacrifice virgins to the Devil?"

"Is it true you sold your souls to the Devil?"

"Is it true that your gifts and beauty come from the Devil?" "Is it true you use sex for holy-communion?"

"Is it true you drink animal or human blood to stay young, beautiful, and live long?"

"So, do Witches really fly?"

"I hear Witches can turn children into toads, is that true?" "Do you guys truly curse people with bad-luck and disease if they step on your toes?"

"Is it true that Magic comes with a price?"

"What's the difference between Astrology and Astronomy?"

"What's the difference between a Pagan and a Witch?"

"What's the difference between 'Magic' and 'Magick?"" "You believe in many gods, right?"

"Do you believe in Jesus, and that he died for you?"

"Do you believe there's Heaven and Hell?"

"Do Fairies and Mermaids exist?"

"Are you some kind of feminists?"

"It seems like Pagans are always attacking Christians; Do Pagans and Witches hate Christians?"

"Why do you worship idols (practice Idolatry)?"

"How do you know you wouldn't have been happier with a different religion?"

Some of these questions could use a very short, simple and single 'Yes' or 'No' answer, or something in-between, while some could only have justice done to them if the answers were expanded on, ranging from a few lines or paragraphs to even pages; (some actually require a book of their own). But some, if not most, are as complicated as can be, even bordering on near-impossible to explain clearly and satisfactorily. So, some of the questions I'll address directly, and for some others I'll just write freely and let you find or deduce the answers from within the pages.

Yep! Merry meet!! The Witch is back!!! With more oomph to keep you witchy and pagan, while helping inquirers and seekers know a few things about us. I say 'a few things' because it is not possible to know it all from just an inquiring position. You can sit by a swimming pool and read all you can about water and swimming, but until you actually get into the water, you'd only suppose and assume you know something about swimming. So, even if you could read all the materials out there on Pagans, Witches, Witchcraft and Magic; even if you could flip through the Book-of-Shadows of every Witch that ever was, is, and will be, you would only at best know a few things about Pagans, Witches, Witchcraft and Magic. As a matter of fact, you're so likely to become more and more confused with too much theoretical inquiry. There will always be Theory, and there will always be Practice. They both form a complimentary pair — two sides of the same coin, you may say; one without the other is near impossible to imagine. The Jamaicans have a saying, that "Half the truth has never been told." Thus, whatever you may know about one side of a coin will always be a fraction of the whole, just as inquiring all you can about Witches and Pagans without truly being involved practically, will always be a partial knowledge about them; never, ever, the whole truth.
